"Der Untergang"- Downfall (2004)

Summary: Traudl Junge, the final secretary for Adolf Hitler, tells of the Nazi dictator's final days in his Berlin bunker at the end of WWII. In 2005, Downfall was nominated for an Oscar at the 77th Academy Awards for Best Foreign Language Film. It won the 2005 BBC Four World Cinema competition, and the film was also ranked number 48 in Empire magazine's "The 100 Best Films of World Cinema" in 2010.

- **Saturday, February 23, 7:30**

"Sophie Scholl - Die letzten Tage"- Sophie Scholl: The Final Days (2005)

Summary: A dramatization of the final days of Sophie Scholl, one of the most famous members of the German World War II anti-Nazi resistance movement, The White Rose. The film was presented at the 65th Berlin International Film Festival in February 2005 and won Silver Bear awards for Best Director and Best Actress (Julia Jentsch). It was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film.
